## CALL FOR PROPOSALS

**NONIE Meeting 2011**  
**28 – 29 March**  
**Paris, France**

The Agence Française de Développement organizes the 2011 NONIE annual meeting. According to NONIE's mandate the conference will focus upon rigorous impact evaluations and is targeted as a priority towards evaluation departments of donor agencies and representatives from partner countries (IOCE, M&E units of ministries).

The meeting is open to non members in order to share different perspectives on impact evaluations.

### SCOPE

The 2011 NONIE meeting is intended to allow discussion on lessons learnt from undertaking impact evaluations. If not exclusive of other topics, proposals on the following subjects are encouraged:

- **The match between interventions, questions and methods**
- **Where are we in terms of supply and demand of Impact Evaluations? with a special focus on Africa**
- **Institutional experience of Impact Evaluations (presentation of different perspectives from ODA organizations, evaluators' networks, NGOs, Foundations and Research Centres will be favoured)**
- **Meta-analysis and synthetic reviews of Impact Evaluations**
- **Impact evaluation utilisation for policy making**

Case studies presentations will be limited, although one or two sectoral sessions will be dedicated to such presentations if they also fuel methodological or conceptual issues as match between interventions, questions and methods. A short poll will be soon issued to better understand what the NONIE members' expectations are: its results will be used to finalize the selection of proposals, in particular for case studies presentations.

The organizers invite submissions on these issues from NONIE members, M&E units of partner country ministries as well as researchers and third parties working with NONIE members who have conducted and/or managed impact evaluation of development interventions.

### SUBMISSION GUIDELINE

Each submission must include a title, author(s) name and affiliation, presenter's name, presenter's bio (no more than 150 words) and contact details, and list of key words. The abstract should not be more than 1,000 words.

For the conference, a powerpoint presentation will be asked.
